Overview

What telecommunications are available in Sierra Leone?

Telecommunications in Sierra Leone include radio, television, fixed and mobile telephones, and the Internet. Radio is the most-popular and most-trusted media source in Sierra Leone, with 72% of people in the country listening to the radio daily.

Is there a radio station in Sierra Leone?

Radio is the most widely accessed broadcast platform in Sierra Leone; eight out of 10 (81%) Sierra Leoneans have access to it. Forty-seven percent of the population listens to the radio daily. However, radio listenership is fractured, with no single station able to reach a national audience.

What is the most popular media source in Sierra Leone?

Radio is the most-popular and most-trusted media source in Sierra Leone, with 72% of people in the country listening to the radio daily. Sierra Leone is home to one government-owned national radio station and roughly two dozen private radio stations, as well as one government-owned and one private TV station.

What percentage of Sierra Leoneans listen to radio?

Forty-seven percent (47%) of Sierra Leoneans have access to radio and listen to it daily. In all, eight out of 10 (81%) Sierra Leoneans have access to radio. Radio listenership is fractured, however, with no single station able to reach a national audience. Around 50 radio stations are currently broadcasting, with many of these having limited, local broadcast reach.



Which social messaging platforms are used in Sierra Leone?

WhatsApp is the only other social messaging platform, aside from Facebook, accessed from a phone and used by more than 1% of the population in Sierra Leone. It is used by 2% of adults. While some other social messaging platforms are available for use in Sierra Leone, less than 1% of the population reports using their phones for this.

How has the media changed in Sierra Leone?

Since the end of the war in 2002, the media and communication sector in Sierra Leone has significantly diversified and decentralised. This period has seen the growth of emerging communication platforms such as mobile phones and the internet and a proliferation of radio and TV stations.
