

How to assemble a mobile base station battery







Overview

Can you put alkaline batteries in a base station?

NEVER insert regular alkaline batteries into the Base Station as they may damage the device. Plug your Base Station back into power. Was this helpful?

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How many batteries does the base station take?

The Base Station takes four (4) 1.2V, 1300mAh nickel-metal hydride (NiMH) rechargeable batteries. Regular alkaline batteries should never be inserted into the Base Station, as they may damage the device. Once you have acquired the necessary NiMH rechargeable batteries, you can follow the steps below to replace them:

How to build a cascade of batteries?

To build a cascade of batteries (e.g. a stationary battery near solar panels and an APC at base power input), separate networks with transformers. Prefer a tree-like (or star-like) scheme of power supply over chain (cascades).

Do I need to replace my base station's batteries?

If you're not certain which system you have, see the Which Version of the SimpliSafe® System Do I Have article. You will likely never need to replace your Base Station's batteries as they are rechargeable and meant to last. The Base Station takes four (4) 1.2V, 1300mAh nickel-metal hydride (NiMH) rechargeable batteries.

How do I replace a NiMH rechargeable battery?

Once you have acquired the necessary NiMH rechargeable batteries, you can follow the steps below to replace them: NEVER insert regular alkaline batteries



into the Base Station as they may damage the device. Plug your Base Station back into power. Was this helpful?

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What is a battery kit?

Kit (Battery) is used to create stationary battery cells, which can provide big and stable energy storage or energy buffer for your power needs. Its energy storage is 3.6MJ or 1kWh. Any battery slowly loses stored energy. Batteries in a vacuum drain at 50W. Batteries in atmosphere at drain at 10W at or above 0°C.




