Overview

Telecommunications in Sierra Leone include radio, television, fixed and mobile telephones, and the Internet. Radio is the most-popular and most-trusted media source in , with 72% of people in the country listening to the radio daily. What telecommunications are available in Sierra Leone?

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How has the media changed in Sierra Leone?

Since the end of the war in 2002, the media and communication sector in Sierra Leone has significantly diversified and decentralised. This period has seen the growth of emerging communication platforms such as mobile phones and the internet and a proliferation of radio and TV stations.

Is there a radio station in Sierra Leone?

Radio is the most widely accessed broadcast platform in Sierra Leone; eight out of 10 (81%) Sierra Leoneans have access to it. Forty-seven percent of the population listens to the radio daily. However, radio listenership is fractured, with no single station able to reach a national audience.

What is the most popular media source in Sierra Leone?

How has the radio landscape changed in Sierra Leone?



The radio landscape in Sierra Leone has diversified and become more localised throughout the last decade. This change has resulted in a much more fractured listenership: no single station reaches more than one-third of adult Sierra Leoneans. In contrast, only 31% of rural audiences can access TV or DVD content.

Does Sierra Leone have a mobile and media landscape?

Sierra Leone has a media and mobile landscape, but there is a lack of accurate, up-to-date, nationally representative data about how people use and access media and mobile phones.
