Why is the energy sector important in Trinidad & Tobago?

The export of petroleum, petroleum products and petrochemicals account for nearly 80% of Trinidad and Tobago's (T&T) export revenues and thus, the energy sector remains a cornerstone contributing significantly to government revenue, export earnings and GDP.
